#### **New State Note**

GA - Note A

Any person who supplies durable medical equipment to a consumer in Georgia shall possess a durable medical equipment supplier license issued by the Georgia Board of Pharmacy pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 26-4-51. The following are exempt: (1) Pharmacies and pharmacists; (2) Hospitals; (3) Ambulatory surgical centers; (4) Health care facilities owned or operated by the state or federal government; (5) Skilled nursing facilities; (6) Assisted living facilities; (7) Health care practitioners who: (A) Provide durable medical equipment within the scope of practice of the health care practitioner's profession; and (B) Are licensed in this state to practice the health care practitioner's profession. (Added: 02/01/2018)

## Pennsylvania

### **State Note Update:**

PA - Note D

A Bedding and Upholstery Registration and Disinfection Permit are required if a company (in-state or out-of-state) sells, rents or leases secondhand mattresses, pillows, bolsters, feather beds, and other filled bedding, cushions, upholstered furniture and bulk materials. Permits are location specific. An out-of-state company also has the option to: (1) Secure the services of an individual holding a valid PA Disinfection Permit to disinfect secondhand bedding before they are sold or leased in PA. (2) Establish a facility in PA where the disinfecting process will be performed in order to apply for and obtain a Disinfection Permit. (3) Secure the services of a department approved disinfector lab to inspect and approve the disinfection process being performed out-of-state.
